## FOREWORD

The thematic tributes of the scientific journal of the Department of Theatre Studies of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens *Parabasis* have a respectful tradition and give each issue, both in Greek and foreign language, a special profile. Following the special tributes of the last years, «Theatre and Nature», «Dramatic Text and Oral Improvisation», «Music and Dance in the Theatre», «Writers and Plays of Modern Greek Theatre», «Ancient Theatre and its Reception», there now follows a volume dedicated to the theme «The Greek Revolution of 1821 and the Theatre (Drama and Stage)», which was composed and redacted on the occasion of the 200th anniversary of this world-historical event that led to the foundation and existence of the Greek state as a separate and autonomous administrative entity and a basic cell of European civilization.

In addition, for this top historical event the Department of Theatre Studies of N.K.U.A. organized the anniversary conference «The Greek Revolution and Theatre», which, on the one hand, was part of the more general celebrations of the 200th anniversary of the 1821 Revolution and, on the other hand, was combined with the celebration of the 30th anniversary of the Department of Theatre Studies. This major conference was held from 10 to 12 November 2021 in the Aula of the Faculty of Philosophy and in the Lecture Hall of the Greek Language Teaching Centre at the Zografou Campus and was dedicated specifically to Professor Emeritus Nasos Vagenas and Professor Emerita Anna Tabaki for their work and contribution to the Department of Theatre Studies of N.K.U.A. A total of 78 attendees participated with papers, most of which will be included in the Proceedings, to be published soon.

The tribute of volume 19 of *Parabasis* is therefore a complementary event, which has the same objective, i.e. to emphasize the overall contribution of theatre to the War of Independence as well as exploring the various reception of the War of Independence in modern Greek and world drama and theatre. The redaction and edition of the book *1821 and the Theatre. From Mystification to Demystification* by Walter Puchner, which was published in 2020 by OTAN Publications in Athens, was motivated exactly by the same desire and objective.

This special tribute includes in the foreign language issue of the journal (19/1) the following studies: Walter Puchner, «Laienschauspieler und Dramatiker als Freiheitskämpfer der Griechischen Revolution von 1821», an article emphasizing the agonistic action of actors and playwrights; Dimosthenis Fistouris, «The subject matter of the Greek Revolution of 1821 on the operatic stage through the aspects of Philhellenism-Orientalism by European composers and Folklorism-Nationalism by Greek composers», an article covering the musical theatre; Kyriaki Petrakou, «Lord Byron's icon in the Greek theatre and cinema», an article that sheds light on the reception of Lord Byron, that emblematic figure of the War of Independence, in the Greek theatre and cinema.

More specialised are the topics of the Greek-language issue (19/2), which includes also three contributions: Zafiris Nikitas, «Aspects of patriotism in the interwar period. The 1821 in the dramaturgy of Vassilis Rotas»; Leonidas Papadopoulos, «Re-enactments of the Greek Revolution of 1821 on the theatre stage of the State Theatre of Northern Greece»; Kyriaki Petrakou, «Legendary and underestimated heroines of the Greek Revolution: Bouboulina and Manto». With these research contributions, the anniversary volume 19 of the *Parabasis* complements and extends the rich thematic coverage of the previous conference and other editorial activity which were realized in the frame of anniversary events related to theatre and is a worthy addition to the series of tribute volumes offered so far by the journal, which in 2025 will celebrate 30 years of existence and contribution.

In addition to the special thematic tribute, Volume 19, both in its Greek and foreign language issues, includes a wide range of articles with free subject matter, unpublished dramatic texts and book reviews of publications and monographs in the field of drama and theatre studies, thus continuing to contribute to the scientific enrichment and promotion of theatrological research in Greece and worldwide.
